Peter, Paul, and Mary

The folk trio Peter, Paul, and Mary were one of the most popular folk group in the 1960s. The group consisted of Peter Yarrow, Paul Stookey, and Mary Travers. In the 60s, folk music had a *revival* especially those that had political views. Although the trio's music had some serious lyrics, their music was well received by audiences of all ages. They would often use comedy to soften the seriousness of their music – sometimes they would make fun of themselves.

Some of their biggest hits were "<u>If I Had a Hammer</u>", "<u>Puff the Magic Dragon</u>", "<u>Where Have All the Flowers Gone</u>", and "<u>Blowin' In the Wind</u>". The group continued to be popular into the next two decades. They continued to perform in concert and on a few television specials.
