Choose: Replacement Issue or Extra Credit Issue

Sometimes you will not be happy with the score you earned on a *Scholastic News* issue and/or Quiz Whiz. Luckily, there is a way to make it better by doing what we call a REPLACEMENT ISSUE or REPLACEMENT QUIZ WHIZ...or both!

Here are the directions:

1. Do the *Scholastic News* and/or the Quiz Whiz, as usual, making sure to do your very best! Don't forget to have an adult check things over before handing them in.

YOU STILL NEED TO HIGHLIGHT IN THE ISSUE...so even if you are only handing in a replacement Quiz Whiz, you need to highlight in the issue.

2. On the bottom of the Checklist, instead of an extra credit question, you will see that a space is left for you to write in the name of the *Scholastic News* issue and/or the Quiz Whiz that you are replacing.
3. You may replace any issue and/or any Quiz Whiz. So, for example, you might do the back of the replacement issue for one *Scholastic News* and do the Quiz Whiz for a different *Scholastic News*.
4. Hand the work in on time, as no late replacements will be accepted.
5. If you are only replacing an issue, you do not need to do the Quiz Whiz and vice-versa. But, you still need to hand in the checklist so that we can see which assignment you are replacing.

EXTRA CREDIT - For up to 10 points

If you have done well on all of your *Scholastic News* issues and Quiz Whiz assignments, you can do the back of the issue for extra credit instead!

If you choose to do the extra credit, you do not need to do the Quiz Whiz at all. You do not need to hand in the checklist, either. Just do the back of the issue, highlight inside and hand it in.

Write: EXTRA CREDIT next to your name and block.

Extra Credit issues are scored differently than regular issues. You start with 10 points. For each error you make, you lose a point. If you get down to zero, no extra credit is earned. Most issues are worth 20 points, so there is a chance that you could have 10 points of correct work and still not get any extra credit. You start with 10 points and to keep them all, you must have a perfectly done issue.
