Personal Achievement Record Guidelines

Students will have the opportunity to participate in celebration activities. Points will be accumulated in the following four areas: timely homework completion, documented study time, test and quiz scores, and appropriate classroom behavior.

How Can You Earn Points?

- 1. Homework must be completed on the due date.
- 2. Study Log must be completed, including parent's/guardian's signature, and turned in on the test date.
- 3. Test scores must be 75% or higher.
- 4. Classroom behavior must be appropriate and respectful. (See Classroom Behavior Guidelines for more information.)

Extenuating Circumstances:

- 1. If you have family obligations and are unable to finish a homework assignment by the due date, you can still earn a point for that assignment. Here's how: bring a note signed by a parent/guardian stating you need more time, then turn the assignment in on the agreed upon new due date.
- 2. Your focus should be on you and how you are doing getting homework done on time, being prepared for tests by studying, doing your best work on test/quizzes, and how you are behaving at school.
- 3. Understand, if you are doing your best job as a student, chances are high that you will earn enough points to attend the celebrations.
- 4. If you have been out of school (family event or illness) arrangements will be made so you will not be penalized.

Celebrations:

- 1. Teachers will plan some of the celebration activities.
- 2. Students will submit ideas for and help plan celebrations as well.
- 3. Celebrations will vary in length of time.
- 4. Celebrations will occur approximately every 5 or 6 weeks.
- 5. Students need to have earned 95% of the total points possible to attend a celebration. Total points possible will vary. Typically, students may lose 2 or 3 points and still qualify for the celebration.
