
Summer Reading Challenge


Goal: Read 100 books this summer!






Summer Reading Challenge

Goal: Read 1,500 minutes this summer!

Each represents 15 minutes. Every time you read 15 minutes, color in one box. When you fill all of the boxes, that means you have read 1,500 minutes!







Printing Notes:

- -Print the two page back to back and fold into thirds to make the brochure.
- The brochure looks good in grayscale, too, if you are looking to save your color ink. Just choose grayscale as a print option.

Why are there two versions of page 1?

Two versions of the summer reading challenge are included. Choose the one you print depending on the reading challenge you want to give your students. 1) 100 books (better for younger grades who read shorter picture books) 2) 1,500 minutes (better for older kids who are reading chapter books, where 100 would be an unrealistic goal for the summer)
