

Why focus on American Samoa?

2. Samoans recognize a third gender that they call fa'afafine, people not considered biologically female but who have taken on the "way of women" in dress, mannerism, appearance, and role.









A <u>biological concept</u> determined on the basis of **primary sex characteristics**.


Once we have made up categories or concepts, it is easy to **reify** them.


That is, to treat them as real and universal and to forget that we made them up.

Masculinity


The physical, behavioral, and mental, or emotional traits believed to be characteristics of males.


An unknown, but significant amount of observed differences between males and females is socially created.


A "Lily Footed" Woman of China—this outrage against Nature has been in vogue 900 years.




