We practice using our spelling words in class daily. If you need extra practice at home, try some of these fun activities. These optional activities do not need to be turned in, but used only for additional practice in preparation for our Spelling Assessment each Friday.

<p>Write your spelling words in ABC order.</p> <p>a art b bear c cat</p>	<p>Write your words with a pencil and then go over them with a crayon or marker like <u>rainbow</u> writing.</p>	<p>Write your words in pyramid form.</p> <p>F Fo Foo Food foods</p>
<p>Number the alphabet from 1-26. Then ask a parent or sibling to unscramble the words in your notebook. Correct that person's work.	Write all spelling words. Circle the vowels in each word with a crayon or pen in red.

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Find synonyms (words that mean the same) for 10 spelling words.	Write each spelling word without its vowels. Replace each vowel with a circle.	Write all spelling words using rainbow colors (each letter is a different color.)
Write spelling words in bubble letters.	Write your words three times each in your very best handwriting.  <b><u>**Must do**</u></b>	Choose five words to make acrostic poems with... Fun: Funny clown Under the tree Needs to sleep.
Write a TV commercial using all your spelling words. Read it to a parent or sibling! Have them sign it.	Write your spelling words and add how much they are worth. Consonants are worth 5 and vowels are worth 7. Told=5+7+5+5=22	Write all spelling words. Circle the vowels in each word.

<p>Write your spelling words in ABC order.</p>	<p>Write your words three times each in your very best handwriting.</p>	<p>Look at your telephone keypad. Make each letter into the numbers on the keypad. Now write your spelling words using this code!</p>
<p>Write a mnemonic sentence to help you remember each of your spelling words. Each letter of the word should start a word in the sentence. For example, a mnemonic sentence for the word throw might be <u>T</u>ed <u>h</u>as <u>r</u>ented <u>o</u>ne <u>w</u>heelbarrow.</p>	<p>Write your words around the outside of your paper. Keep going until you get to the middle.</p>	<p>Write a song or a rap using all of your spelling words.</p>

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Write silly sentences that include all your spelling words. Underline your words.	Write your spelling words with dots in pencil. Then use a marker or crayon to connect the dots.	Draw a picture and write your spelling words in the picture. Try to hide the words!
Your job is to write a creative letter to Superman (or another superhero). In your letter, you must use each of your spelling words. Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.	Write your words three times each in your very best handwriting.	Write each of your spelling words. Next to each word, write a rhyming word. If necessary, your rhyming words can be nonsense words, but make them follow the same spelling pattern.
Write a riddle with each of your spelling words. Don't forget to write the answers to your riddles.	Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, e=5, etc. Then after writing your spelling words change them to a number and add them.	Draw a picture of a great big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the flower petals or on a leaf. Draw extra flowers if you run out of room.
