Course Objectives:

Civics is an introductory course to how our local, state, and national government works. This course is important to all students because we as citizens of this country should know both your rights and your responsibilities. Overall this course will help prepare you by helping you gain a well-rounded understanding of how the U.S. government works.

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism is the practice of taking someone else's ideas and passing them off as your own. In every level of education plagiarism is not allowed, thus it will not be tolerated in this class. Any student caught plagiarizing will be required to resubmit the assignment for a reduced grade.

Electronic Devices:

To maintain a productive learning environment in the classroom, the **use of cell phones or other electronic devices is prohibited**, unless given permission to use by the teacher. The use of cell phones without permission will result in it being confiscated until the end of the school day.

Grading Policy:

The grading policy is as follows in a weighted scoring system:

- Classwork / Projects 60%
- Test / Quizzes 30%
- Entrance / Exit Slips and Homework 10%

All assignments and homework is due on the due date. Students who do not complete the assignment will be given a one week grace period to make up that assignment for full credit. If it is not completed by the end of the grace period, no credit will be given. Monitoring grades should be a partnership of students, parents, and teachers by using ______. Grades will be updated every week and should be continually monitored.

End of Course Exam:

All civics students are required to take quarterlies and an end of course exam (EOC). Students will take the test at the end of the school year during the first part of May. An exact date will be provided as the test date nears along with parent notification. Student scores on the exam will count 30% towards their final grade. As a result of this high stakes test, it is essential that all students attend school daily and participate fully in all class activities both in school and at home.

Expectations and Consequences:

It is my expectation to maintain a positive classroom environment that will be conducive for learning at all times. Behavior expectations are as follows:

Expectations:

- 1. Arrive to class on time with all required materials.
- 2. Raise your hand when requesting to participate in class discussions.
- 3. Use accountable talk.
- 4. Stay in your assigned seat and ask permission before moving about the room.
- 5. Respect yourself and others.
- 6. Refrain from eating and chewing gum, water is permitted but no soda/juice.
- 7. Refrain from using cell phones in class (unless expressly permitted)
- 8. Hats / hoods should remain off the head until the end of class.
- 9. Earbuds, Beats by Dr. Dre, and other listening devices should be stowed in your backpack.
- 10. Spinners are not permitted (besides they are so last year...).

Consequences:

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Seat change / conference with student.
- 3. Parent contact
- 4. Parent / Teacher(s) conference
- 5. Referral to administration
