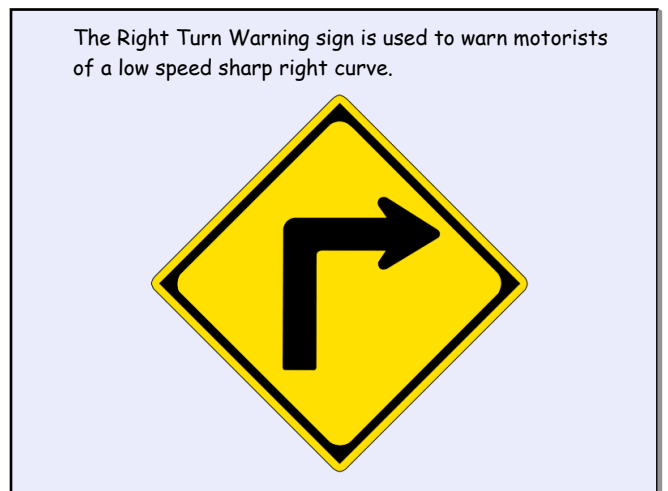
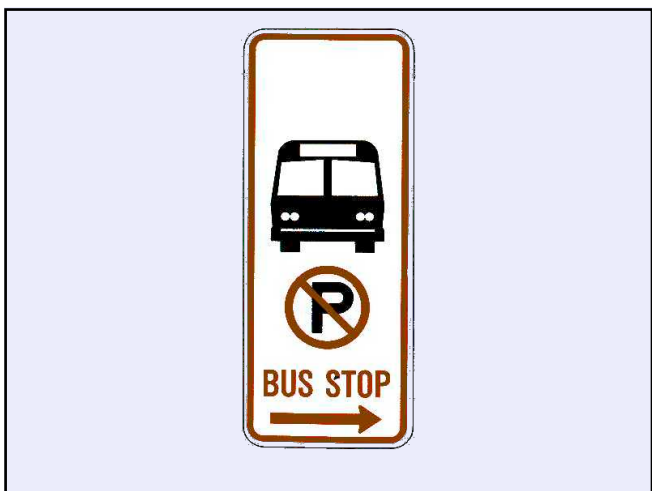
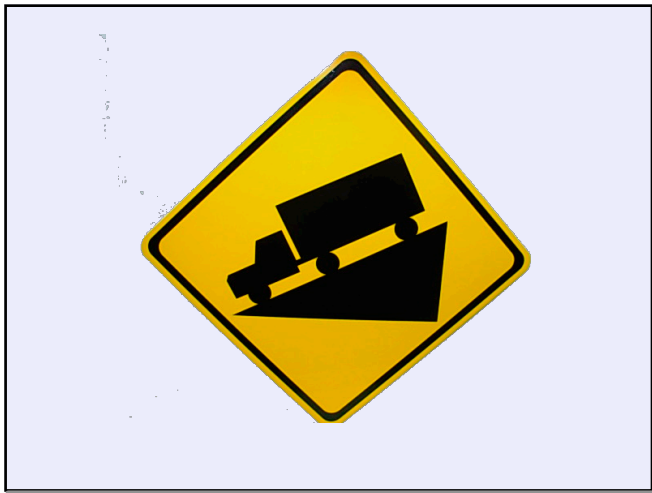


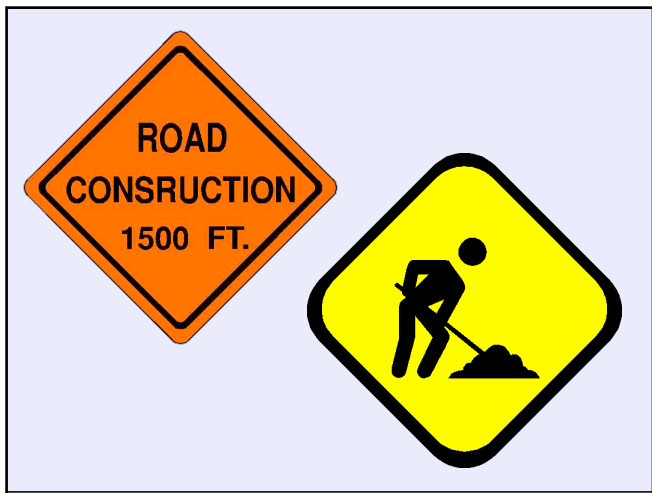
Traffic Signs



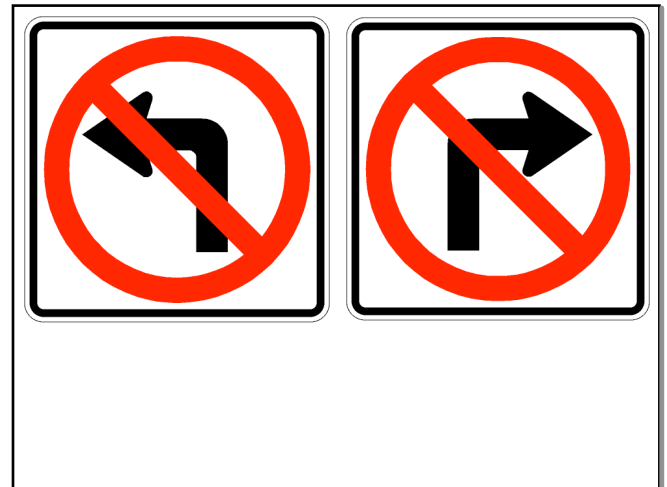
A YIELD traffic sign indicates that a vehicle driver must prepare to stop if necessary to let a driver on another approach proceed (but has no need to stop if his way is clear). A driver who stops has yielded his right of way to another. In contrast, a stop sign always requires a complete stop.







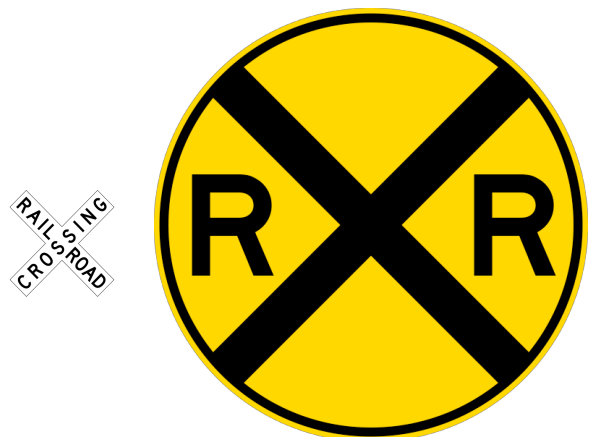
The Pedestrian Crossing sign is used to alert motorists in advance of locations where unexpected entries into the roadway or shared use of the roadway by pedestrians might occur.



The Playground sign is used to give advance warning of a designated children's playground.



The Railroad Crossing Advance Warning sign is typically used to warn motorists of a railroad crossing.





The Side Road Warning sign is used to warn motorists of the presence of a side road intersection and the possibility of turning or entering traffic.



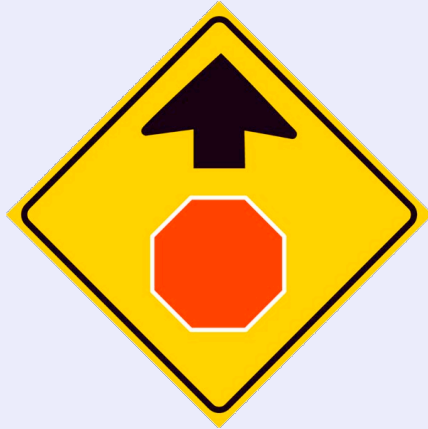
The Signal Ahead sign is used to give advance warning of a traffic light ahead.



The Slippery When Wet Warning sign is typically used to give warning of slippery conditions.



The Stop Ahead road sign is used to warn and alert motorists of a stop sign ahead.



The Yield Symbol Ahead Warning sign is used to warn and alert motorists of a yield sign ahead.
